

NURSERY

This week in Nursery, we have been reading the story of 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. We have been on our very own space adventure and have been finding out what sounds we might be able to hear in space. One of our teddies kept hiding so we were using positional language to find out where he was. We have started to practise for our Christmas performance so have been learning all of our songs. Our favourite song this week has been 'When Santa got stuck up the chimney'.

Next week we will be learning about the season of Winter and will be learning about the changes that happen. In Maths, we will be comparing different groups of objects by size and quantity.

RECEPTION

We have thoroughly enjoyed the story 'Whatever Next!' by Jill Murphy. Our children have re-told the story by acting out key events. We have also created some wonderful pictures and models. Please have a look at our work which is displayed on the Reception topic board. Our Reception mathematicians have been learning the range of key vocabulary related to subtraction e.g take away, subtract, minus, leaves, difference. We have been using a range of props, songs and rhymes extend our knowledge, to understanding and vocabulary. We are also well under way with our Nativity rehearsals. We have noticed lots of budding performers who are enjoying rehearsing on stage. Let's hope confidence remains strong in front of a packed audience!

Next week we will be starting to think about Winter and we will be exploring a range of fiction and non-fiction books. In our Maths lessons we will be comparing numbers and amounts and we will be identifying which is 'more' and 'less'.



YEAR 1 NEWS....



We have had an interesting week in Year 1. We have planned a party and invited characters from 'The Jolly Postman' story, designing special invitations. In Maths we have looked at the properties of shapes and sorted them into groups. In Science we have continued our work on materials and talked about how we use them. Next week we will look at measuring weight, capacity and time. We will write a funny party story and continue our work on materials.

YEAR 2 NEWS....



Grammar this week has been all about sentences. We have been learning about the different types of sentences we can use in our writing and also making sure we remember punctuation. Some of the children have enjoyed writing exclamation sentences. They found it particularly funny to write some funny sentences about their teacher!

In Maths we have been continuing with addition and subtraction. Ask the children to show you how they can add 11 and 21 to any 2 digit number in their heads. Cricket has been the focus of PE for the last few weeks and will continue for another week in preparation for our competition on 8th December. We are getting very good at cricket now and Mr Smith our coach commented on what a fantastic class we are in terms of behaviour and talent!

Next week is assessment week and we will be doing some very informal quizzes to assess where the children currently are.

YEAR 3 NEWS....



This week in Literacy we have been learning about adverbs. We wrote poems using adverbs. In Maths we have been learning about telling the time and Roman Numerals. In History we learned about diseases and medicine in Tudor times. Next week we will be learning about fractions in Maths and Myths & legends in Literacy.

YEAR 4 NEWS....



This week the children in Year 4 have been working hard on fractions. We can now find fractions of numbers and add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. In Literacy we have been reading fables and trying to guess the moral in the story. We have also been getting better at using speech marks in preparation to write our own fable next week. In Topic we found out about Tudor children's lives and what school was like for them. Next week we are going to start making our Christmas cards and calendars.

YEAR 5 NEWS....



This week in year 5 we have looked at what fractions are and then started to add them together – we will continue with this next week. Through SPAG we have looked at verbs and changing tense as well as adding extra relative clauses.

In Topic we have created a mythical beast which will become one of the lead characters in our myth story next week.

This week in R.E we have started to look at the Jewish faith and acted out a scene about Abraham (The Founder).

We have also started to learn our Christmas songs for the concerts and will continue to practise over the coming weeks. Keep practising at home too!

YEAR 6 NEWS



The children have worked fantastically hard all week. in Maths we have focused on converting between metric and imperial units and rounding whole and decimal numbers. We have also done lots of arithmetic practice and have made huge progress in this area. In SPAG we have looked at hyphens and sentence structure whilst in reading we have looked at the structure of texts and predicting what happens next in a story. Next week we will focus on assessments in Maths, Writing, SPAG where we will hopefully see lots of progress. Keep up the hard work and continue to encourage your children to attend booster sessions – it really helps!
